President's Thoughts



I went to Midwinter Retreat on the weekend (February 6-8) and heard Phillip Pike, the keynote speaker, talking about Carl Honore's book "In Praise of Slow". It's about how taking a "slow" approach to most, if not all of life, gives us back our life. I learned a lot at Midwinter, from what is happening with the Mohawks in Tyendinaga, to what's happening at CUC, to how Brian Norman can keep a group singing for hours, to how talented the Unitarians are who come to Midwinter and to how much fun it is to play Euchre until midnight. The weekend was a healthy balance of serious and silly.

But now I'm back and I'm thinking slowly and writing slowly. I'm thinking slowly about the work that must be done before our AGM in April. I'm thinking about the financial scenarios that the board must develop and present to the congregation at our AGM. As you know, our expenses are greater than our income and if this doesn't change, eventually our building fund will be gone. This is not a doom and gloom statement, just a little bit of reality. So we all know what this means. Just like in a family situation, we'll have to send the kids out to work, sell the silverware, take in tenants, move in with a cousin, run weekly rummage sales or move to a

cheaper house in the country.

What's clear is that something has to change. There is no status quo for us. We will either plan our own changes or we will wait for time to change our future. The question for us is how long do we wait before we take control of our destiny? What future do we see for Don Heights? What role can Don Heights play to fix the world in the broken places? Why is it important that Don Heights survive beyond us? What plans do we need to develop and implement to turn things around?

It was a wonderful slow weekend at midwinter, and I'm trying to apply slow, thoughtful conversations and slow thinking to our task of designing our change.

Debra's Deliberations



A day of rain and the little green shoots are attempting to revive themselves. There is something in the tenacity of nature that gives me strength and hope. If a tiny plant can survive the harsh winter conditions, if the squirrels and birds can find sustenance to survive, then surely we as a species can show resiliency in the face of economic and environmental challenge. I am inspired by the little green shoot.

Such an array of information is thrust upon us, usually more doomsday than uplifting, however every once in a while ... one item that caught my attention was that in a study of times of depression and recession, overall health seems to improve. I guess with less disposable income there is less overindulgence in unhealthy foods. There is forethought about using fuel, walking perhaps instead of hopping in the car and turning down the heat. Perhaps there is deeper thoughtfulness about all actions, and this is good.

Then there were conversations with some individuals who live on very limited income. Their comments were that they hadn't noticed a big difference except that there seems to be less 'day old' products at the grocery store. One has to have a certain level of wealth to notice its absence I suppose. Will this economic situation result in some narrowing of the gap between rich and poor – I wonder, or just more poor? When more people have to live on minimum wage or social assistance, will it be adjusted so that it is possible to live on – I wonder.

As we continue with Strategic Planning and the Board addressing finances as directed by the congregation at the general meeting in January, the viability of full-

time paid ministry at Don Heights is obviously in my thoughts and on the table. The reality of our financial situation includes the fact that the cost of ministry is a significant part of the budget. Mostly, I can be objective about this; the bond between us is strong, the trust mutual, the common purpose of the well-being of this community shared, so it can be about the position and not me personally. The health of the congregation and the depth of our mutual trust will enable us to have open and truthful dialogue as we chart our future course.

My commitment to this congregation and the work we can do together is solid. The visions, personal and collective, can become reality. So while we do struggle with the realities of this time in both human and Don Heights' history, I am strengthened by what we have to offer the world and each other during these challenging times. I am inspired by the green shoot.

Now is the time to reinforce our efforts to welcome those in need of our inclusive message. Now is the time to vision what is possible, to offer a counterpoint to the negativity and down-turning news. Now is the time to lift our voices and actions to comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable.

We come together to build a community of hope, a temple of possibility, a congregation of justice-seeking, broken world healing, ever-questioning, loving people gather to transform our own lives and the world.

I find myself reflecting on a reading titled *We Build Temples In the Heart* and offer this stanza in closing.

*Yes here we build temples in our hearts,
side by side we come,
scavenging the ages for wisdom,
cobbling together as best we may
the stones of a thousand altars,
leveling with doubt,
framing with skepticism,
measuring by logic,
sinking firm foundations in the earth
as we reach for the heavens.*

If there is a program you would like to have our group support, let me or any member of the committee know about it and we will discuss how we can help. The next committee meeting will be Monday, March 9 at 5:30 p.m. Bring a brown bag supper or a dish to share and come prepared to get involved, enlightened, or both. At 7:00, after the meeting, we will see the video *To See If I'm Smiling*, an Israeli film about six female Israeli soldiers stationed in Gaza. They talk about themselves before, during, and after their military service. Come for the meeting, the video, or both. You can be sure there will be lots of good discussion.

At our January Meeting we discussed the need for immediate humanitarian aid for Gaza. As a result, and thanks to the quick response of the Don Heights Board to this emergency situation, we held a special collection for the Red Cross at the Sunday Service on January 25. Our generous Don Heighters have donated \$1127 to this important cause.

Our group continues its support of SOS (Street Outreach Services) and reminds you they need mittens, socks, hats, and toiletries for the at risk young people they support. Many Don Heights meetings and social events have been graced by the click of knitting needles as our members knit scarves and hats for SOS. If you're doing any traveling this winter, you can help by collecting some of the mini-toiletries available in most hotels, motels and resorts. Bring your contributions to Don Heights and Tom Brown or someone on our committee will be sure they are safely delivered to SOS. If you want to knit for SOS speak to Rosemary Wood. If you have yarn or large knitting needles you'd like to donate, bring them to Don Heights and leave them on the Social Action table.

Our monthly letter writing campaign on behalf of various causes also continues. On Pot Luck Sunday each month there will be copies of letters which can be used as templates for your own letters on situations of concern. In the last month letters were written on behalf of Amnesty International, Omar Khadr at Guantanamo, and the humanitarian needs of the people of Gaza. Believing that letter writing is an effective tool for social change, the Social Action Committee urges all Don Heighters to get involved in this way.

By the time you read this we should have a vertical banner hung by the visitors' table in the service room. Attached to the banner will be sample letters on issues of concern with addresses of people to whom the letters might go. We plan to have a letter writing table set up on Potluck Sunday for those who enjoy communal letter writing.

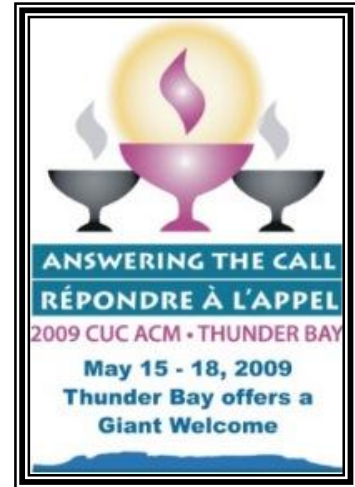
